Meetings during the 2019-2020 year

The Committee normally meets at least twice in the fall and twice in the winter terms. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the University closure in mid-March 2020, the Committee cancelled our spring meeting. Meetings for the 2019-2020 academic year were held on:

- Final meeting cancelled due to COVID-19 University closure

Despite having only met three times, the OLSAC discussions in 2019-2020 led to the development of several new initiatives and several important recommendations.

Accomplishments for 2019-2020

Resource Lists

- The Committee began work on a series of resource lists for OISE students:
 - o Identified key topics for resource lists (e.g. Mindfulness in Education; Research Methods and Design in Education Research, etc.)

- Developed a preferred template for resource lists (see examples of two resource lists in Appendix A)
- Identified preferred channels for distributing resource lists (in print at the reference service desk; electronically on the OISE Library website)
- Developed a resource list for the OISE International Students Association covering academic writing (see Appendix B)

Social media campaign plan

- The Committee developed a plan for a social media campaign featuring members of the OISE community and the library resources that have shaped their teaching, research, or professional practice.
 - o Participants will be asked to submit the title of their selected book (or other library resource), as well as a short blurb (2-3 sentences) about why they picked the resource and the impact it has had on their teaching, research, or professional practice.
 - A librarian or a member of the student advisory committee will arrange a meeting with the participant to take their photograph with the resource (if it is available in a print physical format) and secure permission to post the image on the OISE Library's social media channels (Twitter and Instagram).
 - The plan will not require new social media accounts but will make use of existing social media channels at OISE, the OISE Library, OISE Communications, and the GSA.
 - We hope to begin to implement this project in the 2020-2021 year.

Input from OISE students



- Review the findings from the OISE GSA's Equity and Accessibility Students' Survey 2018-2019 and consider initiatives to improve Library spaces and services to address concerns and issues raised.
- Explore ways the Library can support online student initiatives including online conferences, and remote attendance at conferences.


